 - You'll work with experienced local teachers to create lesson plans and plan games and activities to keep children engaged and actively learning.
 - You can also teach special educational needs and participate in a literacy program.
 - Mentoring Programs, volunteers also serve as mentors and role models, inspiring Maasai children to dream big and pursue their goals, beyond academics.
